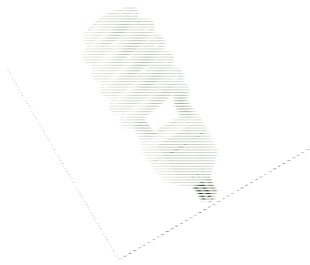


## Mercury Containing Lights



Why recycle Fluorescent, CFL, & HID lights? **Washington State law makes it illegal to throw away mercury containing lights in the garbage.**

Where can I drop off my lights?

**Lowes and Home Depot accept small numbers of CFLs at their customer service desks at no charge. The lights must be bagged before placing in the receptacle.**

**Light Recycle Washington Sites accept a maximum of 10 lights per day per person at no charge. Visit [LightRecycle.org](http://LightRecycle.org) for more information.**
